HOLE IN ONE START IN BELMONT GOLF CLASSIC

Twenty four year old Victorian golfer Luke Bleumink stole the show at the Greater Building Society Lake Macquarie Amateur Championship at Belmont today when he started his round with two birdies and a hole in one.

Hitting off the 10th, Bleumink had a birdie 4 and followed it with a birdie 3 on the 11th and a hole in one on the 134 metre par 3 12th.

Bleumink finished his first nine with a three under par 33 and had an even par round on the second nine to finish with a 3 under par total of 69.

Unfortunately his fine round followed a five over par 77 yesterday.

Another Victorian Kieran Pratt, of the Commonwealth Golf Club, still held the lead after the close of play today when he followed his magic seven under par 65 yesterday with a one under par 71 today, giving him a total of eight under at 136.

Australian club member Daniel Bringolf slipped into second place when he followed his 68 yesterday with a 69 today to put him at 137.

Young Perth player, Aidan Bae, is in third place after following his 68 yesterday with a 70 today to leave him on six-under at 138.

Local champion Brendan Smith is one of four players poised on five-under at 139 after he followed his two under 70 yesterday with a solid 69 today.

Also on five under are 17 year old South West Rocks schoolboy Jamie Hook who followed his scorching 66 yesterday with a 73 today, Jordan Sherrat, of Adelaide, and Matthew Wittenberg, of Avondale.

Two of the best rounds today came from Daniel Beckman of the Yarra Club in Melbourne and Ben Clementson of Sydney's St Michaels Club. Both had six- under 66s.

Beckman had seven birdies and one bogey and Clementson had an eagle on the 9th and five birdies and a bogey.

Bardwell Valley veteran Lester Petersen followed his 69 yesterday with 71 (4 under) and on the same score were Oatland's player Byong Hyun Son who had two 70s and Adam Downton, of Ashlar in Sydney, who followed his 68 with a par 72.

Son's 70 today included an amazing three eagles on the 4th, 10th and 16th holes.

The cut in the field for the final two rounds tomorrow and on Sunday will be 80 plus ties.
