

NACE CIP Peer Review

Description The NACE CIP Peer Review is a detailed oral examination in front of a three-member review board that lasts approximately 2 hours and is graded on a pass/fail basis. The Peer Review includes a series of questions to test the candidate's practical and theoretical knowledge of coatings and coating inspection. Candidates are questioned from a random draw of topics ranging from standards, procedures, ethics, coatings use, inspection instruments, role-playing, and specific case questions. Successful completion of the CIP Peer Review is required to achieve recognition as a Certified NACE Coating Inspector.

Who Should Attend? Anyone wanting to complete his or her Coating Inspection Program (CIP) training to become a Certified NACE Coating Inspector.

Prerequisites Those who have successfully completed CIP Level 2 and have two years of verifiable coatings-related work experience may register for the Peer Review.
