JUNIOR PROGRAM

PAYMENT OPTIONS

Junior Membership Subscriptions may be paid;

- On a term by term basis
- Monthly Direct Debit
- By splitting the fee into two payments (applicable for level 1 and 2 only)

STAGE ONE -Thursdays from 4pm-5pm

\$253.00

(includes VGolf Program)

- This is a 12 month program, which is divided up into four nine week programs to enhance and introduce the skill of golf.
- Tuition includes basic fundamentals for all facets of the game.
 - Short Game
 - Long Game
 - Rules and Etiquette
 - Course Management
- Will have the opportunity to play on the golf course under supervision. This will be at least three times each term.
- May play on the golf course on *weekdays and Sundays only, after 4pm or during School holidays* under the guidance of an *adult*.
- Snacks and drinks to be provided after each session.
- No promotion to Stage Two until handicap is obtained.
- Normal club dress code DOES NOT apply for Stage One Juniors.

STAGE TWO - Wednesdays from 4pm-5pm

\$374.00

(includes VGolf Program)

- This program is to develop and enhance skill levels to a higher level and introduce juniors to competition golf.
- This will entitle all Stage Two junior members to play *Sunday* and *mid-week competitions* with an official AGU handicap (*equivalent to 6 day membership*).
- Juniors in Stage Two have the opportunity to attend advanced tuition on all aspects of the game including:
 - Driving
 - Iron Play
 - Pitching
 - Chipping
 - Putting
 - Rules and Etiquette
 - Course Management
- Snacks and drinks to be provided after each session.
- Have the opportunity to represent the club in junior and colt pennant squads.
- No more than two juniors can play in any one group in any club competition.

STAGE THREE – COACHING PROGRAM

\$495.00

(includes VGolf Program)

- Stage Three will allow the juniors under the age of 18 years, to become a seven day member and play on Saturday upon receiving an invitation from the club captain and/or junior committee.
- Have the opportunity to attend Victorian Golf Association advanced junior golf camps.
- Become part of the junior and senior pennant squad.
- Have access to lessons from the club and teaching professional for \$22 (normally \$66).

ALL LEVELS

1. All Juniors must report to the Pro-Shop before proceeding to play.
2. It is imperative that golfing attire, on the course and in the clubhouse, is strictly in accordance with the Club's Dress Code.

Please Note:

1. All Levels have Training Sessions every Wednesday or Thursday evening during school terms. They commence at 4.00 pm. and conclude at 5.00 pm. It is expected that Juniors will arrive **NO LATER** than 3.50 pm.
2. During hot weather **make sure** a hat and sunscreen is worn at all times.
3. It is absolutely imperative that **all** Juniors intending to play telephone the Pro-shop to ascertain course availability. (Ph. 9580 4763)

DRESS CODE

Dress standards are designed to support and enhance an appropriate level of decorum within the Club, and to meet with a degree of acceptability among all Members. Members and Guests are requested to adhere to the dress code, and those not complying may be refused entry to the course and/or clubhouse. The dress code is consistent with most private golf clubs in Australia, and is designed to provide a pleasant environment for golf and hospitality, without being over restrictive. Please note the following:

On the Course – General

- No jeans, denim, leisure suits or tracksuits of any kind permitted.
- Golf shoes with spikes are **compulsory** – no dimple soled shoes, runners, gym shoes, scuffs, thongs, boots or similar footwear permitted.
- Shirts **MUST** have collars – no t-shirts.
- No gymnasium attire – tracksuits, etc.
- All clothing, including headgear, must be free from excessive slogans or advertising.

Boys

- Trousers and shorts must be “tailored”, and not have an elasticised or a draw string waist.
- Shirts must be tucked into pants **UNLESS** designed to be worn outside trousers and shorts by incorporating a fitting ribbed band.
- Short, predominantly white socks may be worn with tailored or dress shorts. Sockettes are not acceptable. Long dress socks may also be worn with tailored or dress shorts. Socks must be pulled up at all times.
- No ‘short’ or athletic shorts permitted.

Girls

- Slacks/pants, skirts and shorts must be tailored and may not have a draw string waist.
- Shirts must have a collar and be tucked in **UNLESS** designed to be worn outside slacks/pants, skirts and shorts by incorporating a fitting, ribbed band.
- Short socks and sockettes may be worn.

The Clubhouse

Neat casual dress is the minimum standard which will be accepted within the confines of the Clubhouse. In general terms, attire that is acceptable on the course will be acceptable in the Clubhouse.

- As with the course, track/leisure pants/suits, ‘casual’ shorts, t-shirts and denim clothing is not acceptable.
- Short socks, which meet the course requirements, may be worn within all confines of the Clubhouse.
- Sports shoes **must not** be worn within the Clubhouse.
- Caps, visors and hats must not be worn inside the Clubhouse.
